Among the many services it offers, Blue River Service's Employment Services Department provides a number of programs with the intent of removing barriers to training and employment. Employment programs include: vocational rehabilitation, vocational evaluation, driver's education, IMPACT, and resume services. Blue River Services provides daily vocational training and work opportunities for persons with disabilities through its sheltered workshops.
